7:10 PM Dave Sieruta opened the meeting, there were 3 new members and 3 guests tonight. from our Mentor Meeting and from the Bee College.

7:15 Minutes for JULY accepted as emailed.

--Presidents Report: Dave announced that he and Bo Sterk delivered a \$400 check to Dr Jamie Ellis at the Bee College and that Dr Ellis has agreed to be our Key Note Speaker at our Second Annual North East Florida Symposium next MAY 16 2020. Also John BoeckstiedI presented Dr Ellis with a Oxalic Vaporizer for the Bee College. Dave will begin advertising our symposium in JAN and we plan to open this up for the full 150 attendees.

--Beginner Bee Class for SEPT 28 from 8-4PM. we have a new AG Center replacement for Luke who is Cassidy Dossin, she is learning about honeybees now and very versed in the 4-H. She will be here for the class and Luke Harlow will be here to assist. Volunteers welcome to help present, set up, clean up and work in the apiary.

--Keep up with your hive inspections and now time to treat for mites without the honey super on. Remember if you do your count and get more than 9 per 300 bees(1/2 cup) you will need to treat. Keep feeding until the first of Sept when the dearth will hopefully be over. If you are using Brood Builder in your sugar water it will help control mites, beetles and ants.

--Apiary Report: (OLD)The Bees will be available soon for the Lottery Mentor Program; to apply send a message to Sue Gianino with your phone number; use the Claybees.com website under the Officers Tab. The price is \$55 and prepare for mentor ship for 1 year. You provide a NUC with 5 clean frames and those frames will be replaced with 5 frames from the Apiary. We cannot sell a queen but you can purchase one from another seller or the NUC will make a queen. We are hoping to have our Queen rearing going by next yr. \*\*Lottery open to new beekeepers without bees first and then to members needing a NUC.

--Louie will take over the Apiary Reports this year, he is there on WED. Dave there on Sat. Louie and Rick started a Top Bar Hive with a Horizontal Longstroth hive in the making.

--7:25 Treasurers Report \$11,186.62. \$400 profit from Symposium delivered to the FL Honey Bee College @ UF for research.

--Mentor Report, Ray noted all went well at the apiary on Sat Mentor Meeting. Our new MemberJoe was there and enjoyed it so much he signed up tonight. We have 9 mentors to help anyone.7:30 Speakers for tonight were the members who went to the UF Bee College:

--Huey Forquet went to the Eastern Apiculture Society Conference and brought a new type of synthetic foundation made from vegetable oil products allowing the queens to immediately start laying in the hive. This conference plans to organize all east coast beekeeper groups, they had 800 attendees & 10 countries in attendance. \*\*Huey has also earned his Master Bee Status by completing the written test, he is still planning his hands on and thesis paper. CONGRATS! --Colleen Fletcher- Marsteller won the trip to the bee College from our raffle. She said there was so much technical data to learn and it was so helpful and enjoyable. She learned that the age of a bee is determined by the amount of hair on their eyes. She learned about the 3 different leg uses for the bee and that if you have 2 hives and one is more gentle, that is the one you want to split and grow more bees from.

--Dave S. went to several classes; one with research on DNA testing on Africanized bees vs European, there are 27 different subspecies and 9 species of Apis. He listened on how small beekeepers are making queens and the nutrition studies on pollen.

--John Boeckstiedl brought a Vaporizer kit to show for Mite control. He donated one to the UF Bee College and demonstrated how they work tonight. He noted that UF studies find 4 Grams of Oxalic Acid works much better that the 2 Grams recommended by the state. Cameron Jack from UF is trying to change the state rules. He uses CO2 with an inflator pump to stun the bees, gathers the brood from the center of the hive and puts them in a plastic tub (1/2 cup bees) the CO2 stuns the bees and the mites making it easier to shake the mites off for the count. Take the number of mites and divide by 3, if 7-9 mites you need to treat the hive. The kit sells for \$330 plus a Mite check for \$30 and you MUST PURCHASE A SPECIFIC GAS MASK. He recommends treating each Spring and Fall but with this method you can use with the super on. You treat every 7 days for 3 weeks or 21 days. The bees are unhurt.

--Susan Welch enjoyed the bee college and felt our Symposium was equally effective with speakers and demonstrations without the travel. Our cost was much cheaper and we

included lunch. The Bee College <u>does let you download</u> all classes which we decided to look into for our next Seminar. Sue has several classes pls email her for info.
