Please see Dave if you would like to get on the list for Package Bees: Money due at the FEB 9/14 meetings to Dave; cost (\$106+ \$1 for gas). Packages available around MAR 22.

Monitor and control Mites and SHB. Varroa populations will begin to grow and treat your hives when you have 3%Mites after a mite check.

Feed your hives and NUCS esp. as the weather gets colder.

Get Swarm Traps out.

NORROA is a new Mite Treatment approved in 20 states and available at MANN Bee Co. A liquid treatment ingested by bees to render the Mite infertile. NOTE: Always get a Mite count before and after treatment to ensure treatment is needed. Don't forget Powder Sugar works well also.

VIDEO on U-Tube. Suggested use at beginning of Honey flow and after honey harvest.

-- Apiary Report: 4 Langstroth, 15 NUCS with Castles. Plan to do splits next year between Apiary #1 & Apiary #2 will do splits and sell them, dissolving Apiary 2. 1 Top Bar not in use.

-- Mentor Report: Ray reports we had 26 Mentors last Sat with Q&A.

7:40 Dave delivered the 2026 Budget Review. See Website for breakdown:

--2025 Budget Income \$25,044, Budget was \$22,090. Expenses \$25,198 with deficit \$84.76

--2026 Budget set \$24,220.

7:53 Dave was our speaker tonight and he spoke on getting the Pros and Cons of NUCs and Packages.

--A NUC is a Nuclear Hive with a working Queen and worker bees. They sell for approx. \$175-225 and range from 4-5 frames. Hives and More is taking orders for their NUCS now. Dave recommends that you also get a NUC Castle at the same time because they build up very quickly and will need a hive or a castle to expand. Advantages: it is a functioning colony, they do not need time to establish, can produce honey the first year, it is a great beginning for a Beekeeper. Disadvantages: They can come with some SHB or Mites, possibly an older queen and old frames. Ask the seller about treatments for SHB and Mites.

--A Package is a 3# box of honeybees with a mated Queen added on the day they are picked up. To install a pkg watch the video from UF Jamie Ellis U-Tube or in our Library. There will be a Demo in our Apiary this Spring when we get our Pkgs. Advantages: Price is less (\$90-\$140) with 10,000 bees. Queenless packages are cheaper still \$20-30. Most packages are Italian Bees. Disadvantages: The producer needs 6-8 months to get the bees; packages will need a lot of attention and feeding initially. Again, Dave recommends 2 packages or NUCS to start your Apiary.
