- -- Treasurers Report \$8148.06 approved as read.
- 7:15 President's Report
- --Dave gave a presentation to the OP Women's Club with 2 new members signed up.
- --Nectar & Pollen are decreasing, start feeding your bees if you have not. Thanksgiving is the start of our Winter, the hives will start to decrease in size, Drones will be gone soon. After NOV 26 Dave and Jamie Ellis cut way back on inspecting hives to keep the hive warm and undisturbed esp. if the temps are below 60.
- --Hive Management: You should be feeding your bees 1:1 solution.
- --Bottle Brush, Spanish Needle, Asters and Black-Eyed Suzy blooming now. Last year the Red Maples started to bloom in DEC which starts our new Spring Season.
- -- Apiary Report, continue to check and treat for Mites. REMEMBER you cannot have honey supers on during these chemical treatments, it will be absorbed into the honey (unless it is the powder sugar method). Keep an eye out for Hive Beetles. A good article in Amer Bee Journal regarding Mite Treatments, special note Dr J. Ellis is a contributor to AMB Journal's Questions and Answers section.
- --**We have 6 Hives now 2 with double deeps and 9 NUCS with Supers. For those interested: You MUST be a member of CCBA with a Mentor (call Ray or Dave). We will start the Lottery again in the Spring; \$55 for new members without bees will be the first chosen. You can leave your NUC at the Apiary for them to create a queen and help us watch them for a month. **Email Susan Welch with your request: swelch5210@gmail.com or Sue G smgianino@bellsouth.net.
